

Topic name	Amazing Humans
Big question	What are humans made from?
Linked books	Nadia - The girl who couldn't sit still. Olympig!
Memorable experience	End of year celebrations.
Outdoor learning	Sports day.
Reading aims	Find evidence in the text to answer questions. Retrieve information from the text. Answering and asking questions.
Writing aims	Writing for different purposes: non-chronological reports, Olympian athlete story and poems
Speaking & listening aims	Take turns in conversations and listen to each other. Drawing on what they already know or on background information and vocabulary provided by the teacher.
Maths aims	Position and direction – year 2 (week 1) Multiplication/Division recap – year 3 (week 1) Time (week 2, 4 & 5)
Science aims	<ul> <li><u>Animals, including humans (continued):</u></li> <li>Recognise the different skeletal structures of humans and animals and explore how muscles and bones are used for support, protection, and movement.</li> <li>Identify the similarities and differences between animals and humans (diets and nutrition requirements, recognising that they cannot make their own food – they get nutrition from what they eat).</li> <li>Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.</li> <li>Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.</li> </ul>
History aims	Understand the significance of sports people who have overcome difficulties and removed barriers to become amazing humans including: Claire Cashmore, Dylan Alcott and Bill Russell.
Geography aims	<ul> <li>Whilst discussing sporting events relevant to the year:</li> <li>- children will be able to identify the position and significance of the Equator, Northern and Southern Hemispheres, the Greenwich Meridian and the time zones (KS2)</li> <li>- children will be able to understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography, building upon prior knowledge (KS2)</li> <li>- children will be able to use the eight points of the compass (KS2)</li> <li>Recap Olympic/Paralympic Games from Beijing 2022 – where was it held and compare to our location</li> </ul>
DT aims	Use the basic principles of a healthy and varied diet to prepare dishes – fruit kebabs. Understand seasonality and know where and how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught, and processed.
