## Goodbye and Thank You!

I would like to say a big thank you to Mrs Dickson who took on the role of class teacher of the Hive from Mrs Morris at Easter. She has been an integral part of our team, making sure the end of year show was ready, organizing our Melton in Bloom team, seeing our Y6 children through SATS and much much more. We are only saying goodbye for a short time as Mrs Dickson has agreed to come back and work with us again in the Autumn term to help support our new Year 6 team as part of the National Tutoring Service, to help fill any gaps children may have.

## Music Provision Autumn Y4,5,6

I have secured further music provision for the Autumn Term for Children in the Hive Class. One afternoon per week, the Hive children will learn how to play a brass instrument from September to December. Following this, parents will be given the opportunity to pay separately for small group or 1:1 tuition if your child wishes to develop the skill of playing the instrument further. The plan is that each Autumn term a new instrument will be introduced, giving children the opportunity to enjoy 3 different instruments over the time they are in the Hive. Further details of paid tuition will follow at the end of the Autumn term.

#### **FOAKS**

My heartfelt thanks go to all those who have contributed over the year to FOAKS fundraising events, however small: it all adds up. The outdoor classroom is an absolute bonus to us and with the pond area very nearly ready to use, this will add another little sparkle to our already fabulous outdoor space. Miss Bray is starting Forest School training in September, so we are looking forward to developing our outdoor learning provision across the school next year.

## Behaviour and Uniform Policy

Our priority, as always in the new academic year, is to get routines and expectations established as quickly as possible to help all children settle after the summer break and feel secure. We are looking forward to building on our exemplary behaviour and attitudes. Children can come to school in their PE kits on PE days as usual, and as this will form children's uniform one day per week, the expectations to wear the correct PE uniform is just as important. Please label all belongings to avoid them being lost. Please keep an eye out and make sure the odd coloured sock, trainers on non-uniform day, or coloured hairband don't start to sneak in over time!

## Parent Feedback

Feedback continues to be positive via our Parent Forum meetings. I am always willing to take ideas, suggestions and solutions to help improve the provision we can offer our children. ### **Communication between Parents and Teachers**

Open communication with parents is vital. If you have a query or concern, we are always happy to help. For non-urgent queries Dojo is the first port of call. Please understand that our teachers will not respond during teaching time but will endeavour to reply within 24 hours. Please avoid sending duplicate messages to teachers to try to get a faster answer as this just causes unnecessary workload, and potentially mixed messages.

If your query is more urgent, please contact the office to make a face to face appointment with your class teacher, in the first instance. Be clear as to your concern, what resolution looks like and how you would like the issue resolved.

If things don't improve, please make an appointment to meet with Miss Digioia, as lead teacher in my absence, or myself.

We are currently putting together dates for the new academic year and we will send these out in good time for the start of the Autumn Term. Children will start back on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> August.
