Our topic has been 'Up In The Trees' which we have learnt through the study of Rainforests. We have looked at climates, identified the equator and discussed why some countries are hotter and some countries are colder. We have enjoyed comparing the Amazon Rainforest to Sherwood Forest. During this topic we have created different collages using water colours, paints, tissue paper, cardboard and even string!
