Challenge a member of your family to complete



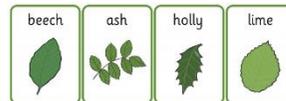
Play battleships with a partner outside.

Present your results in a tally chart or a bar graph.

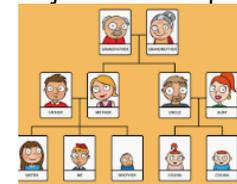
Now is an ideal 'time' to learn all about.....time!!
